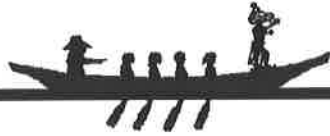

District/Authority and Award Scholarship

APPLICATION PACKAGE:

The District/Authority Scholarships recognize graduating BC students for excellence in their chosen area of interest or strength. These scholarships are intended to provide tuition assistance to students pursuing post-secondary education.

To win a scholarship, a student must apply to the local scholarship committee and:

- Meet the following basic eligibility requirements:
 - Must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant) at the time of registration in the school year for which the scholarship is awarded;
 - Must be a BC resident;
 - Must be or have been:
 - Enrolled in a BC public school (including Distributed Learning schools), or
 - Enrolled in a Group 1, 2, or 4 BC Independent School, or
 - Enrolled in a Continuing Education Centre, or
 - Registered with a public, independent, or distributed learning school in BC as a homeschooled child;in the school year for which the scholarship is awarded

- Meet criteria determined by the local scholarship committee, which requires a student to demonstrate outstanding achievement in any of the following focus areas:
 - **Indigenous Languages and Culture**, demonstrated at school or in the community
 - **Fine Arts** (e.g., Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music)
 - **Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies** (e.g., Business Ed, Technology Ed, Home Economics, Information Communication Technology)
 - **Physical Activity** (e.g., Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics, not limited to Physical Education)
 - **International Languages** from the International Languages curriculum or External Assessments, including AP and IB courses
 - **Community Service** (Volunteer Activity), which includes awareness of local, global, and cultural issues
 - **Technical and Trades Training** (e.g., Carpentry, Automotive, Mechanics, Cook Training)

- Fulfill the BC Graduation requirements of either the 2004 Graduation Program or the Adult Graduation Program by August 31st of the student's graduating year

I am happy to enclose the updated information and materials regarding Coastal Community Credit Union's 2021 Scholarship Program. Coastal Community is committed to building healthier communities and supporting youth to be leaders by encouraging them make a meaningful difference in their communities and then rewarding them through scholarships to pursue post-secondary education. **Please note applications are only accepted through our online application that can be found at cccu.ca.**

Again, this year, we will be awarding 8 grade 12 students each with a \$2,000 scholarship. IAN FORD TRUST FUND BURSARY CRITERIA

The Ian Ford Trust Fund Bursary was created from funds donated to the Village of Port Alice, in memory of Ian Ford, who lost his life in a mudslide, while working with the Public Works Crew to clear a roadway. Mr. Ford had been an Alderman for several years, and was in charge of Public Works, as well as Emergency Coordinator for the Village. He was employed by Western Pulp Ltd., as Safety Coordinator.

1. Available to any graduating Vancouver Island student, or student from an outlying area within the Association of Vancouver Island and Coastal Communities (AVICC), who intends to enter post secondary studies in any course of study, at any recognized post-secondary institution, immediately following high school graduation.
2. Students entering their second year of post secondary study may also apply.
3. Bursaries will be awarded annually in June, and must be claimed within the year immediately following the award (January acceptance is acceptable). If a course of study has not begun by January of the following year, the bursary will be forfeited, and will pass to the next qualified applicant, or will be held and awarded at the next June graduation. The Bursary will be for a minimum of \$250.00, but may be for a greater amount, depending on funds available that year.
4. In order to claim a bursary that has been awarded, the student must furnish proof of **full-time** registration at a post secondary institution. This proof should be in the form of a copy of receipt of payment for courses. When proof of registration is received, the funds will be paid to the student or if requested, to the institution.
5. Students applying should have a C+ or better standing, and must be qualified for acceptance at a post secondary institution. If there is any doubt as to a student's ability to continue, the school may be contacted for verification. Preference may be given to students demonstrating need, as well as reasonable scholastic achievement and community involvement.
6. All applicants must submit, along with the application form, a letter about themselves and their activities, outlining their "need" and their future goals.
7. The decision of the Selection Committee shall be final.
8. All applications must be received at the address below, no later than APRIL 1st of the current year.

John Warner Memorial Scholarship

History

John Warner lived in Alert Bay from 1963 to 1988. He was the Principal of St. Michael's Residential School and later became a member of the Board of Education for School District No. 85 (Vancouver Island North).

John was committed to his community and was an active volunteer. He was always interested in education and was involved in his work as School Trustee for Alert Bay when he suddenly died of a heart attack in June of 1988.

John left behind his wife, Marion, and four children. Friends of the family wished to provide a memorial to John Warner. It was their hope that, in this way, John's work will be continued and remembered.

Eligibility

This scholarship of \$300.00 will be awarded to a North Island Secondary School graduate from Alert Bay who intends to continue his/her post-secondary studies. Applications must be submitted to the school's scholarship selection committee (deadline to be determined by the school). The scholarship will be paid upon proof of registration at a recognized post-secondary institute in the province of BC.

The award will be presented to a grade 12 student of Aboriginal Ancestry who demonstrates an overall commitment to their future goals in forestry. One Scholarship award will be available to one grade 12 student within the school district. If there is no Indigenous student pursuing forestry, the award can be made available to a School District 85 Indigenous graduate student pursuing post-secondary studies in fisheries or other natural resource management fields. The student selected does not have to demonstrate financial need for the award.
